Hundreds of vessels were lost in the Great Lakes during the past three centuries. Many of these historic shipwrecks lie in the shallow coastal waters of Lake Huron between Port Austin and Port Huron, Michigan. Some are known vessels and others have never been identified. All are fascinating relics of maritime history that boaters and snorkelers can visit and examine, even from the surface.

Our team of archaeologists, historians and divers is investigating a selection of these wrecks to describe the vessels and make their stories more accessible to the public.
